WIRELESS SERVICE PROPOSED BY THE CARRIER APPLICANT WILL STILL HAVE "DEAD ZONES," "GAPS," AND "BLACK HOLES" IN THEIR PURPORTED COVERAGE AREAS..

COVERAGE IS NOT THE LOCAL JURISDICTION'S PROBLEM.

COVERAGE IS NEITHER GUARANTEED BY THE FCC NOR THE TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACT OF 1996.

- THE PROPOSED CAMOUFLAGED STRUCTURES:

DO NOT MEET "MINIMAL INTRUSION" CRITERIA.

ARE VISIBLE OFF-SITE ABOVE TREE LINE.

ARE VISIBLE THROUGH TREES IN FULL LEAF.

ARE NOTICEABLE BY CASUAL OBSERVER.

WILL NOT LOOK LIKE TREES NATIVE TO EASTERN VIRGINIA.

ARE NOT COMPLETELY SURROUNDED BY MATURE TREES.

ARE NOT SURROUNDED BY A 100 FT. BUFFER OF TREES.

WILL BE EASILY SEEN BY VISITORS APPROACHING THE HISTORIC KINGSMILL PLANTATION WHICH IS ON THE NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES.

COULD HAVE AN ADVERSE IMPACT ON THE SCENIC VISTAS AND MARKETABILITY OF NEARBY RESIDENT'S HOMES.
